### **Public Participation**

There were no members of the public in attendance.

### **Police Matters**

Inspector Michelle Shooter introduced herself and confirmed that she has been in the post since the end of June carrying on from where Adam Waterfall left off. PCSO Cocking advised the meeting of the crime figures for August/September. The production of crime figures are being reviewed. August figures include: 10 assaults, 2 sex offences, 2 burglaries, 1 theft of vehicle, 17 criminal damages and 7 drug offences. Crime figures in general are down on previous months. PCSO Cocking was very positive that they are getting to grips with the youths in the area and that they are working to gain public confidence but it was acknowledged that there is still a lot of work to be done. PCSO Cocking also reported 22 calls for anti-social behaviour, several calls being neighbourhood incidents. Under age drinking is also an issue and 'Operation Rhubarb' is being used.

Councillor Riggott queried if the crime figures provided a breakdown of the Parish to find any local hot spot areas. Inspector Shooter confirmed weekly meetings are held regarding anti-social behaviour problems but she was satisfied that hot spot areas are dealt with. PCSO Cocking confirmed there had been problems at Kenning Park but these have now been tackled with the assistance from the Library staff.

Councillor Skinner questioned who decides the definition of an anti-social behaviour order. Inspector Shooter confirmed that the operator in the Call Centre determines if the call is anti-social behaviour. If this proves not to be the case there is still a call history logged and Officers can investigate any problems.

Councillor Mansbridge asked Inspector Shooter her view on the possibility of losing 25% of Officers due to potential budget cuts. Inspector Shooter stated that whatever happens the Police will deal with the crimes and prioritise, always with careful management of staff.

3. ***the Budget Cut – Effects upon Clay Cross document submitted by Councillor Skinner is supported on the following grounds:***
  - a) ***that singularly one area of cuts would cause poverty and hardship. Collectively these cuts in a whole range of benefits will be disastrous to low income families already struggling to 'make ends meet'***
  - b) ***that these cuts will do nothing to stimulate the local economy because many people receiving these benefits already work and all it will do is reduce there already poor spending power ultimately causing a knock on effect to other people in work***

- c) ***that the cuts will lead to poorer health through less healthy food being bought and reduced leisure activities for families, especially young children as families and individuals have to cut back to pay priority bills***
- d) ***that many families already suffering debt will be in deeper debt, greater bankruptcies, and more evictions both rented due to reduced housing benefits and owner occupiers relying on tax credits and Council tax benefit reductions***
- e) ***that the Parish Council is concerned about the possible rise in crime through the inevitable increase of debt on individuals and families***
